

The Promises

 Create and launch and Indigenous History and Allyship Module (Rec. #24)

- In **November 2022** a survey was launched to assess learning needs and interests among the DTC student population.
- On January 31, 2023, an Indigenous-specific focus group met to review TRAP 2023 and module ideas.
- On September 1, 2023, the pilot module "Truth and Reconciliation - Introduction to Indigenous Issues and Culturally-informed Care" will become compulsory for all current students.
- In **December 2023**, edits will be made to the module based on student feedback.
